  - Research Advisory Council (RAC)
  - Centres of Research Expertise
  - Other
- Organizational interest in evidence based policy, practice and decision making



#### **The Return to Work Problem**

- Steady deterioration of Return to Work outcomes over a decade
- Significant increase in case duration and costs
- Unhappy stakeholders



## **Strategy**

- New Service Delivery Model
  - structure
  - redesigned roles
    - greater frontline specialization, focus and expertise
    - increased capacity to provide RTW assistance in the workplace
  - process
  - practice
    - increased personal communication & information gathering
    - timely decision making
    - earlier intervention in RTW & health care treatment
- Focus case management approaches and interventions for WSIB case managers, RTW co-ordinators, and nurses to RTW process and outcomes
- Adopt and adapt the work disability prevention paradigm (Loisel)



## **Collaborating with Researchers**

- Identified who could and would participate
- Created a "table" for collaboration
- Levelled on our thoughts and interests
- Began with a practical draft tool
  - are we interpreting the research as the researcher intended?
  - are we translating the research correctly?
- Feedback and refinement
- Moved on to next item of interest/concern to us



## **Challenges**

- Some parties vested in paradigms
- Tension between theory and practicality
- Balance between ideal solution and ability of staff
- Introducing fundamental change driven by research
- Mapping risk factors to effective interventions
  - more known about one than the other, especially when multiple risk factors are present



#### **Key Success Factors**

- Leveraging existing relationships with researchers
  - research advisory groups
  - IWH Plenary Sessions
  - expert forums
  - Lunch & learn sessions
  - topic specific teleconferences
- Having done our homework on the literature
- Investing time to understand each other
- Senior level support both "sides"
- Exposing the developers and users of the tools to the researchers



## **Insights and Surprises**

- Researchers were thrilled to be asked
- Researchers who are also practitioners are particularly effective at bridging research and practice – high credibility
- Researchers moved us away from a desire to construct highly controlled interventions
- Simplicity of some of the tools astonished staff
- Greater confidence in the soundness of tools and interventions



#### **Has It Worked?**

- For the 1<sup>st</sup> in a decade, RTW outcomes have improved
- For the 1<sup>st</sup> time in decade, case duration has declined at the 3 month and 6 month milestones
- We are encouraged, optimistic, and continuing to use research to build strategy and practice
  - work reintegration
  - healthcare, for example, narcotic use
